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DEMAND ANALYSIS





HC Childcare Centre (HCCC) is a non-profit organization, and has been providing high-quality childcare to the Quinte region for over 20 years. HCCC opened our first location 20 years ago when we saw a need in the community for high-quality childcare that was affordable, and a location that was convenient for parents. At HCCC we see all children as capable and competent learners, and utilize *How Does Learning Happen* to lead us in our programming and pedagogy.



EMPLOYEE ACQUISTION

HC Childcare Centre has developed a dynamic and innovative plan to recruit and retain employees. Within the Child Care sector, the workforce plays a fundamental role, dictates the ability to operate, and the quality of programming and care that a centre offers. HC Childcare Centre will connect with local colleges (Loyalist College, St.Lawrence College, Fleming College) to mentor students, and attract possible employee's once their studies have been completed. HCCC will attend local in-person and virtual job fairs; and share first hand experiences working at HCCC. During the job fairs, HCCC would utilize the opportunity to share knowledge on grants and education opportunities for individuals to return or enter school to gain their ECE; opportunity to work at HCCC and gain their ECE at the same time. Contact Employment agencies to conduct information sessions and seminars regarding a career as an ECE at HC Childcare Centre, to showcase opening, recruit qualified staff and showcase education and grant opportunities.

HC Childcare Centre will also retain and recruit the required and qualified staff by ensuring staff have access to:




DEMAND ANALYSIS

HC Childcare Centre is opening a second location, as the demand for childcare in Hastings County is greater than the supply. In 2022, Stats Canada released that just over 50% of children in Belleville, aged 0-6, were in child care in early 2022 (1). In 2020, Belleville's population for children under the age of 5 was 3,920 children (2), and most childcare centre's within Hastings County are currently maintaining waitlist due to the high demand for licensed childcare. Currently at HC Childcare Centre West, there are 50 children on the waitlist. With HC Childcare Centre expanding to a second location downtown Belleville, it will allow HC Childcare Centre to drastically reduce, if not eliminate the wait for childcare. HC Childcare Centre has deployed a survey to individuals within Hastings County to determine there childcare needs. The results of the survey below support the need for increased childcare in the area, and help indicate the support and hours parents are looking for (3):





What do you feel is the main deterrent in accessing childcare in Hastings County?




